SEMINAR FOR TOMORROW'S LEADERS

SEMINAR FOR TOMORROW'S LEADERS is a powerful leadership training seminar sponsored by Rotary Clubs in central Florida. Approximately 160 Rotary sponsored delegates from more than 100 high schools participate in this program.

Incoming high school seniors attending the S4TL are challenged to utilize all their available skills, knowledge, talents, expertise, and intelligence toward achiev-



ing specific goals and objectives.

S4TL is composed of first year Rotary sponsored delegates, second year delegates called Red Shirts, third year delegates called White Shirts and fifth year students called Special Assistants to the Director.

The first year delegates are placed in groups of about ten in which they will work together throughout the seminar. The Red Shirt delegates are the group leaders who function as "platoon leaders" for the group. It is in this capacity that they develop further leadership skills.





Rap Sessions

Three afternoons are spent in "Rap Sessions" where approximately 15 delegates and 3-5 visiting Rotarians participate in an open discussion of topics chosen by the delegates. The sessions are lively, opinionated and enlightening for all. They afford the delegates an opportunity to express and defend their opinions and ideas that might not be shared by all.



The ultimate objective/goal of S4TL is for each student to leave the Seminar with new awareness of himself/herself, and more finely tuned to utilize their given abilities to serve others in leadership capacities throughout life. Socialization and fun are definitely part of the program from talent shows to friendly competitive games.
